The chiropractic profession, along with the rest of the medical profession is facing significant changes in policies and procedures in 2014. In no other time in the last 20 years have we seen so many changes go into effect in one year. The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act will require significant changes. Coinciding with these changes is the mandatory transition to the newest version of diagnosis codes, ICD-10, on October 1, 2014. These significant changes will impact the chiropractic office because if any office does not make the transition by October 1, 2014, reimbursement will abruptly stop.

New Documentation Guidelines for insurance companies, EHR and Medicare now makes your documentation critical. Dr. Fucinari will update you on the latest requirements, expectations and protocols pertaining to Documentation and Coding. He will also show you the requirements for the Electronic Health Records (EHR) guidelines and Meaningful Use.
